31 individuals shall make up the Board of Directors which is focused on undergraduate students only.

Financial Transparency, Accountability & Responsibility

- Commitment to ensuring due diligence practices and precautionary measures are mandatory for monitoring, evaluating, and reporting financial decisions, reports, and practices
- Ensuring the RUSC is committed to serve in good faith on behalf of the student body membership, Ryerson University, and all involved parties; not itself as student governance
- To demonstrate and request a high level of student approval before any major decisions are made that can adversely affect students and the Ryerson community at large

- Commitment to developing, providing, and maintaining equitable access, opportunities, and services to all students
- Embracing, adapting, raising and challenging the standards to the evolving diversity, culture, environment, and needs at Ryerson to remove barriers and biases that disenfranchise invisible, marginalized and underrepresented communities
- Fostering an ongoing dialog to engage with all members of the Ryerson community at large to integrate diverse and inclusive practices & programs through the RUSC
